Opportunity and Responsibility to
Kids) provides temporary cash aid
and employment services to needy
families with children.

The program may be able to provide supportive services, such as childcare, transportation, work or training-related expenses and other services necessary for a successful transition from welfare to work.

Let CalWORKs Employment Services work for you!



Employment is key to families successfully transitioning from public assistance and to become self-sufficient. CalWORKs offers a variety of services to help parents find and keep jobs. If you participate in CalWORKs, you may receive:

- Behavioral health services
- **Educational opportunities**
- Financial assistance
- Free childcare
- Housing assistance

- Help paying for work or work-related expenses
- Help paying for transportation
- Job preparation, assessment & training
- Job search activities
- Services for mental health, substance abuse or domestic violence issues
- Work experience

The amount of cash aid a family can receive depends on:

- Number of people in the family
- Current income, if any
- Special needs of family members
- Other resources

A Shasta County Employment & Training Worker will work with individual families to develop a welfare-to-work plan and discuss supportive service needs.

CalWORKs families may also qualify for:

Medi-Cal

Low- or no-cost health coverage may be available to children and adults who are eligible for CalWORKs.

CalFresh

In most cases, eligible CalWORKs families qualify for CalFresh to help meet their food needs.

Women, Infants and Children Program (WIC)

Provides food and nutrition information to low-income pregnant women, mothers, infants and children up to age 5.

Nurse-Family Partnership®

Helps first-time parents succeed by having trained nurses visit young, firsttime moms-to-be early in pregnancy. Visits continue through the child's second birthday, assuring a healthy start for babies and stability for the whole family.
