To the Shasta County Board of Supervisors,

On behalf of the Fall River Resource Conservation District (RCD), I am writing in support of the Fountain Wind Project, which is under development in our district. The Fall River RCD is the parent organization of the Burney Basin Fire Safe Council, which collaborates to develop projects that make Burney and the surrounding communities more fire resilient. Additionally, the RCD has already spent millions of dollars, within the district, near the community of Burney, on forest health treatments. ConnectGen representatives have been discussing future fire safe projects with RCD staff to ensure that vital fuels treatment projects in the area have support and the mechanism be implemented.

ConnectGen has gone above and beyond in their efforts to ensure the project will provide ample fire safety benefits to the area in which the project is sited. I have seen firsthand how committed they are to working with the local community to make sure questions are answered and concerns are addressed. I have complete confidence that they will work extensively with local stakeholders, including CAL FIRE, Shasta County, and Shasta Cascade Timberlands to develop an extensive Fire Protection Plan as is outlined in the Environmental Impact Report.

Among the many economic benefits that the project would bring to the area, the Fountain Wind project would create many miles of much needed fire breaks within the project site, which will serve to prevent the progress of forest fires that originate outside of the site, like the Fountain Fire, while also providing improved access to inner areas of the timberlands to fight such fires. Further, state of the art fire-smart technology and fire suppression systems will be built into the turbines, including automatic shutoff and up-tower extinguisher activation, should any mechanical issues occur. In addition, wind turbine technicians will have a full-time on-site presence to aid in the detection of smoke. Detection, access for response, and fuel reduction are critical to helping suppress and control fires as quickly as possible.

Through the above efforts, ConnectGen has demonstrated that it is committed to developing, constructing, and operating the Fountain Wind Project responsibly and safely. Renewable energies like wind power and biomass are both vital components of California's clean energy future. Sustainable forestry and wind power are complementary activities where responsible land use and natural resource management can provide ongoing economic, environmental, and societal benefits. The Fountain Wind Project is the perfect partner.

For the above stated reasons, we respectfully request that you grant the Fountain Wind Project a Use Permit. The RCD is committed to a long-term partnership with ConnectGen to see that vital project work is implemented. Thank you for your consideration.

Dear Planning Commission:

I am writing on behalf of Roseburg Forest Products Co. to express support for the Fountain Wind Project, currently under development in northeastern Shasta County. Roseburg Forest Products Co. has a long-standing history of operating in Northern California and many of our team members choose to make Shasta County their home. Further, many of our key suppliers and clients in Northern California are based out of or operate in Shasta County.

We believe that the Fountain Wind Project will bring many direct benefits to the community and stakeholders in Shasta County as well as indirect benefits to the region. The Fountain Wind Project represents an approximately \$300 million capital investment in Shasta County, which will result in a significant increase in the county's taxable property base - something that this county desperately needs. 
In addition, the project will support up to 200 family-wage jobs during construction, as well as up to 12 full-time jobs, which will provide well-paying opportunities for individuals to remain living and working in northern California. Local hospitality services will see an uptick in business activity, and equipment rentals, materials, and other construction-related needs will be sourced locally, further stimulating the county's economy.

As a large wood products manufacturer and former landowner in the area, Roseburg believes the project will enhance the local fire-risk-reduction efforts already underway. Fire is a key supply chain and operational risk for our industry, and we support efforts to mitigate such risk. The Foundation Wind Project presents stringent and leading risk mitigation practices in place and will complement the existing landowner practices for fire risk reduction.





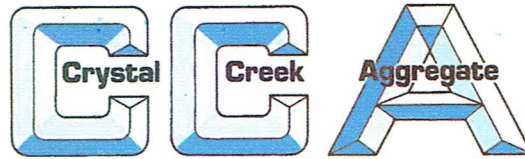

Please accept this letter expressing my support for the Fountain Wind Project and to request that you approve Use Permit 16-007 for this project. I am the President and Owner of Crystal Creek Aggregate, Inc., which has been in operation since 1990. My family has lived in this area since 1954 and owned and operated a lumber mill beginning in 1967. Crystal Creek Aggregate mines and processes aggregate products used throughout not only Shasta County but as far north as Portland, Oregon and to the south to the San Francisco Bay Area. Therefore, in addition to being of economic benefit to our community, the Fountain Wind Project also represents an opportunity to sustain my business.

Another reason for supporting the project is how it can provide additional fire protection to the Round Mountain and Montgomery Creek area. Having experienced the Carr Fire, I have firsthand knowledge of the danger and destruction that can accompany wildfires.

The Fountain Wind EIR clearly provides an overview of the wildfire dangers associated with the project site and the project itself and the mitigation measures required to minimize potential fire impacts. In addition to the EIR requirements, the access roads the project proposes and the cleared areas surrounding the turbines will serve as fire breaks. These fire breaks are essential for not only protecting the surrounding area, but also to provide access to firefighting personnel and equipment. The Carr Fire provides an example of the need for fire breaks. The fire had a tornado-strength fire vortex that was just over the hill from the Crystal Creek mine and plant area. Over the years, I have developed a strong understanding of planning-related issues, both natural and man-made, and the balance needed to minimize potential land-use conflicts while improving our underlying economic base. Shasta VOICES, a local non-profit organization with 1,300 supporters who have been advocating for a sustainable economic future in the Shasta County area for the past 15 years, has been closely monitoring the Fountain Wind Project for the past 16 months or so, and we've done our due diligence and extensive research on the project.

We learned through reference checking ConnectGen, the project applicant, that this an organization who lives up to their commitments, is very fair and responsive to the communities where their projects are located and/or being constructed, and are good corporate sponsors and citizens who have been very favorably received in their communities.

Additionally, landowners near the proposed project have expressed concerns about their home values if this project is approved. So, Shasta VOICES researched and provided a property value assessment entitled ***“The Effect on Real Estate Values in Surrounding Residential Communities”*** in northeastern Shasta County, which ***is attached*** for your review, along with a ***spreadsheet*** for back-up documentation, in preparation of the June 22, 2021 Public Hearing. Mary Machado, Executive Director of Shasta VOICES for the past 15 years, will be speaking in person at the Public Hearing on behalf of our organization, and can answer any questions you may have about this research project.

There have been many large-scale studies done on property values and wind farms, but Shasta VOICES wanted to conduct our own local small-scale, easy-to-understand study because Shasta County does have an actual wind farm project, Hatchet Ridge, with ten years of history that provides us with ***factual real estate sales data*** in the Burney area (as well as Montgomery Creek and Round Mountain) relative to residential property values. The results of that data, as you can see in the document and the accompanying spreadsheet, show that properties sold in that area since 2010 have ***increased in value***, with the average increase being just over ***57 percent***. Therefore, evidence exists supporting that values for the majority of properties located near the proposed project would ***not*** be devalued.

California's Senate Bill 100 (SB 100) mandates all electric utilities in California acquire ***60%*** of their annual unmet energy needs from renewable resources by 2030. SB 100 states that by December 31, 2045, eligible renewable resources and zero-carbon resources must supply ***100%*** of electricity provided to customers. The California Energy Commission (CEC) developed procedures for compliance and enforcement of this mandate. Wind and solar energy meet the renewable resources and zero-carbon resources mandate. Shasta County needs to meet these mandates like every other area of California, and this project will assist in the process of obtaining compliance. The Fountain Wind Project has the potential to provide electricity for more than 86,000 homes, while using up to 72 wind turbine generators.

This Project will provide ***many benefits to Shasta County***. Since 2019, ConnectGen has been committed to developing a Community Development Program up to ***\$1 million (which has now grown closer to \$2 million)***. This program includes a direct investment in the communities of Round Mountain and Montgomery Creek, partnering with a local Shasta County internet service provider to enhance access to high-speed internet service in the Intermountain Region, and



additional fuel reduction projects in the Montgomery Creek and Big Bend communities in partnership with the local Resource Conservation District. The Community Development Program has been developed based on direct feedback from members of the local community. Additional information is available on the Fountain Wind Project website, [fountainwind.com](http://fountainwind.com).

A report done by Economic & Planning Systems, Inc. (EPS), a land economics consulting firm, is available on the Fountain Wind Project website, [fountainwind.com](http://fountainwind.com). It shows that the project is expected to generate substantial one-time and ongoing economic and financial benefits to Shasta County, including:

- Project **construction** will generate **450 job years** (in aggregate), including direct and multiplier (indirect and induced) effects, and about \$27 million in employee compensation, as well as about \$60 million in total economic output/sales in Shasta County.
- Project **operation** will provide **42 ongoing jobs**, about \$2.5 million in compensation, and just over \$6 million in economic output **each year** during its 35-year lifetime. Cumulative over the 35 years, project operations will provide 1,456 job years, \$90.4 million in employee compensation, and **\$210.3 million in economic output** in the County.
- The Project is estimated to generate **\$60 million in new property tax** over the life of the project, about \$1.7 million annually.
- The County could receive about **\$4 million** in one-time County sales and use tax revenues from the construction phase.

***The Effect on Real Estate Values in Surrounding Residential Communities***

A Research Paper – May 2021

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**Executive Summary**

As evidenced in the study of Shasta County public records, Burney's property values have, in fact, increased since the Hatchet Ridge wind farm began operation in 2010. Therefore, evidence exists supporting that values for the majority of properties located near the proposed Project would *not* be devalued.

**Introduction**

ConnectGen is proposing the development of a wind farm in Northeastern Shasta County named the ***Fountain Wind Project*** (Project), to be located near the Montgomery Creek and Round Mountain Communities, and near the existing Hatchet Ridge wind farm located in Burney. The proposed Project has the potential to power more than 86,000 homes. The Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) was released August 3, 2020. The required 45-day public comment review period on this document was extended through October 21, 2020. The Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) was released on May 5, 2021 for public comment.

**The issue researched in this study**

For many people, their home is their biggest investment. So, it's understandable that landowners near the proposed Project have expressed concerns about their home values if this Project is approved. This Research Paper is designed to address this particular concern.

There have been many large-scale studies done on property values and wind farms, but Shasta Voices wanted to conduct our own ***local small-scale, easy-to-understand study*** because Shasta County does have an actual local wind farm project, Hatchet Ridge, with ten years of history that provides us with ***real data*** in the Burney area relative to residential property values. Burney is located approximately 20 miles from the Montgomery Creek and Round Mountain areas.

**Analysis of nearby home property values since 2010**

Research was conducted on real estate sales transactions using the public records for Shasta County, starting in the Burney area. The nearby Hatchet Ridge wind farm (about 5 miles away) began operation in 2010. Before construction of this project, there were some questions and

concerns about the effect such a project would have on the local community, including whether or not it would negatively affect residential real estate values in the surrounding area of Burney.

Some of those same questions and concerns have come up with regard to the proposed Project. Hatchet Ridge wind farm, now in its tenth year of operation, provides some factual information that answers the questions and concerns regarding residential real estate values.

### **Methodology**

Public records were researched to obtain factual real estate sales data in the Burney area (zip code 96013) from sales occurring since 2010 including the following:

- Data for 245 residential properties, of which 101 had multiple sales
- Address of home sold
- Type of home (i.e. single family, mobile)
- Square footage of home
- Date(s) sold
- Sales price for each sale since 2010

The information was entered into a spreadsheet for ease in determining trends after evaluating the data. Of the 245 residential properties, there were 101 that had multiple sales since 2010. Those 101 multiple-sale residential properties were the data points used to determine the percentage of change in value.

The data shows that the properties sold since 2010 have *increased* in value. Here is the property value summary:

<b>Area</b>	<b>Zip Code</b>	<b>Number of Properties With Multiple Sales Data</b>	<b>Average Change in Value</b>
Burney	96013	101	+57%

We then researched public records to obtain the *same* factual real estate sales data listed above in the Montgomery Creek (zip code 96065) and Round Mountain (zip code 96084) areas, which are nearest to the proposed Project, and whose residents have expressed concerns about their property values due to the close proximity to the proposed wind turbines. The few transactions in this area showed the same trend as the Burney area, with similar percentage increases.

It should be noted that, according to the most recent US Census Bureau data through December 2020, the total population of Burney is 3,965; the total population of Montgomery Creek is 157; and the total population of Round Mountain is 89.

### **What other studies have been done on property values and wind farms?**

Researchers at Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory released a major study on wind farms and property values in 2013 entitled “A Spatial Hedonic Analysis of the Effects of Wind Energy Facilities on Surrounding Property Values in the United States (by Ernest Orlando Lawrence

Berkeley National Laboratory).” This study is considered the most comprehensive industry standard for reference purposes.

The study did not discover any adverse impacts to nearby home property values in 2013, which analyzed more than 50,000 home sales near 67 wind farm projects across nine U.S. states. The study concluded that “across all model specifications, we find no statistical evidence that home prices near wind turbines were affected in either the post-construction or post-announcement pre-construction periods.” A subsequent study to the Berkeley study entitled “The Impact of Wind Power on Residential Property Values in the United States: An Overview of Research Findings,” published January 20, 2017 by San Diego University, concluded that nothing has changed since the original study.

There are many other studies, all using similar methodologies (hedonic price method<sup>1</sup>) and data, and they come to the exact same conclusion. Specifically, all large-scale, empirical studies of U.S. wind facilities conclude that, post-construction/operation, there is no identifiable negative effect of wind projects on nearby residential property values. This conclusion is based on the evaluation of 248,560 actual home sales in eight studies.

### **Conclusion**

As mentioned, Shasta County does have an actual wind farm project, Hatchet Ridge, with ten years of history that provides *real data* in the Burney area relative to residential property values. As evidenced in the study of Shasta County public records, Burney’s property values have, in fact, increased since the Hatchet Ridge wind farm began operation in 2010. Therefore, evidence exists supporting that values for the majority of properties located near the proposed Project would *not* be devalued.
